A. Young People, the Church and Society

These questions refer both to young people who take part in Church programs, as well as those who do not take part or have no interest to participate.

- 1. How does the Church listen to the lived situations of young people?
- 2. What are the main challenges and most significant opportunities for young people in our region today?
- 3. What kinds and places of group gatherings of youth, institutional or otherwise, have major success *within* the Church, and why?
- 4. What kinds and places of group gatherings of youth, institutional or otherwise, have major success *outside* the Church, and why?
- 5. What do young people really ask of the Church today?
- 6. What possibilities exist for young people to take part in the life of the Church community?
- 7. How is contact made with young people who do not participate in Church activities?

B. Pastoral Vocational Program for Young People

- 8. How are families and communities involved in the vocational discernment of young people?
- 9. How do schools, universities, or other educational institutions contribute to young people's formation in vocational discernment?
- 10. How are we taking into account the cultural changes of the digital world?
- 11. How can World Youth Days or other national or international events become a part of ordinary pastoral practice?
- 12. How is your diocese planning vocational experiences for young people?
